## **Take it Outside: Terracotta for the Garden with Carol Gouthro**

**9am-noon** 6/25-8/13 \$250

The botanical world is full of many wonderful and inspiring design ideas. We'll utilize these as we combine various handbuilding, sculpting, wheelthrowing and mold-making techniques, to create planters, bird baths, bas-relief tiles, urns and birdhouses. Just as the natural world has endless texture and color, we'll use a rich variety of finishing techniques and materials to enhance our creations, and will fire them to be weather-proof, in most cases. *(Intermediate and advanced students)*

## **Dig In : Terracotta in the Garden with Carol Gouthro**

Learn basic coil and slab techniques in this beginning class, as well as unusual construction methods: folded forms, drop molds, bas-relief molds, and building with tar paper. We will use the rich world of botanical forms as our inspiration to create planters, bird baths, totems, bird houses, finials, and other garden related projects. We'll continue to look to nature as we finish our work with a variety of surface design processes and materials.
